Regional Significance Statement

Owned by the city of Chisholm and operated with the Minnesota Discovery Center and Iron Range Off-Road Cyclists, Redhead is an abandoned mine pit turned world-class mountain bike park. Legislation and passion started the project and it continues to grow. Traversing the red cliffside above the aqua blue Pillsbury Pit offers an incomparable Midwest panorama. Seventy thousand visits in 2022 make Redhead an economic driver for the region and the city of Chisholm.

Overview/Description of Park or Trail

Redhead Mountain Bike Park in Chisholm, Minnesota opened in 2020 and currently has 25 miles of trails. The unique landscape of Redhead immediately made it a must-experience destination. The peaks and valleys carved into the earth by miners creates a naturally dynamic trail system with a pristine, clear lake at the base for paddle sports. Redhead's central proximity to Tioga and Giants Ridge creates a multi-day experience of biking, hiking, and paddling as described in Ride the Range tourism and marketing of the region.

Through a phased process, Redhead is adding more trails and amenities every year, turning the mined and machined landscape into a world-class mountain bike park. Owned by the city of Chisholm and operated in partnership with Minnesota Discovery Center (the trailhead), and Iron Range Off-Road Cyclists (trail

maintenance volunteers), Redhead is a free, public, multi-use trail system for riding and hiking open 7 days a week. The city of Chisholm, Minnesota Discovery Center, and Iron Range Off-Road Cyclists are working together to make Redhead unlike anything in the region.

Redhead MTB Park shares a portion of its trail system with the Mesabi Trail, connecting Redhead directly to 28 Iron Range communities when the Mesabi Trail is complete. Redheads proximity to the Minnesota Discovery Center and the Minnesota Museum of Mining successfully cross-promotes the regions history. Redhead is a product of mining and shares its story with a new audience - outdoor recreation enthusiasts. Future signage throughout the park will incorporate mining and the regions history.

Redhead has already been featured in two films, Reclaimed (a Redhead original production) and Biketown (a story of mountain bikers, unlikely partnerships and the communities they create) by Freehub Magazine, and has won two awards: 2022 winner of Environmental Initiative Award for Rural Vitality by Houston Engineering and 2022 winner of the Minnesota Brownfields Award for Innovation. Redheads soft opening during the Pandemic in 2020 prevented a rush of attendance, but not for long. Our trail counter has tracked 70,000 ins of bikers and pedestrians at the trailhead between May 2022 and December 2022. Redhead hosted over 4,000 athletes and spectators at the Minnesota Cycling Association's All Team Finale Race in October 2022 with youth racers from across Minnesota representing 130 schools. Mountain bike enthusiasts from all over the US and even internationally are coming to Redhead for its premier trails. Locally, Redhead is the destination for an impressive hiking community and group rides.

Redhead plans to add more adaptive ADA accessible trails, amenities, a paved pump track, and skills course. Currently, Redhead is known for its technical and difficult trails which appeal to advanced riders. The expansion plans will make Redhead a family-friendly adventure riding destination as well. The city of Chisholm is poised and ready to grow alongside its mountain bike park to offer more businesses and amenities for tourism and recreation.

Minnesota Discovery Center operates water recreation rentals in the Pillsbury Pit including canoes and kayaks. Families can take Redhead's shuttle van down to the dock for swimming and paddling.

Minnesota Discovery Center also rents snowshoes in winter.

30West (privately owned Chisholm business) is located on site at Redhead (in MDC) to rent and work on bicycles.

General Site Characteristics

Redhead Mountain Bike Park is unique in its features and offerings. The trailhead is located at the Minnesota Discovery Center, the largest museum complex in Minnesota outside of the Twin Cities. Within the city limits of Chisholm, (population 4,775) the topography and vistas offered throughout Redhead MTB Park are unlike any found within 1,000 miles. Purpose built, world-class mountain bike trails throughout the park offer adventure and challenge to all skill level riders. Redhead is considered by many to be the most scenic,

unequalled park in the Midwest.

Redhead is built around abandoned mine pits: Pillsbury, Glen, Leonard, Leonard-Burt, Monroe-Tenner, and Dunwoody. The machined landscape offers red rock outcroppings, cratered deep blue lakes, expansive overlooks, towering cliff faces, rugged bedrock, and rich, iron-stained dirt. The red dirt left behind on bike jerseys and hiking boots have become a Redhead badge of honor. "It's kind of like the Grand Canyon of the north with mountain bike trails around its perimeter." -Lee Bloomquist, Business North

Additional Supportive Information:

Redhead compliments four existing recreational amenities: the Mesabi Trail, Giants Ridge, Tioga, and Cuyuna, making northern Minnesota perfectly situated to become an international destination for mountain bikers, hikers, and outdoor enthusiasts of all ages and skill levels. Between all four mountain bike parks there are 145 miles of trail, and each trail system has something different to offer its users. Redhead's distinguishing features include epic panoramas from bluffs and overlooks, historical and scientific interpretive signage, and proximity to operative mining and museums. Redhead fills a gap between Giants Ridge and the West Range and provides accessibility and reason

for enthusiasts to Ride the Range. The initial Phase I build of Redhead Mountain Bike Park was awarded by the Minnesota Iron Range Resources and Rehabilitation at \$1.77M. The entirety of this funding was spent on what will qualify as the most difficult trails. The city of Chisholm's Redhead department has an annual budget of \$100,000 for operations and maintenance. Iron Range Off-Road Cyclists have a maintenance budget for Redhead of apx. \$10,000 annually. Redhead MTB Park is currently seeking funding for Phase II Trail build outs and amenities through the Legislative-Citizen Commission on Minnesota Resources (LCCMR) grant process. Currently, Redhead's projects have been recommended by the LCCMR Commission to receive \$1.666M in funding. If awarded, projects include: adaptive trails, trailhead amenity development, a pumptrack and skills course.

Classification Details

Special Recreational Feature Park Classification

Provides a High-Quality Outdoor Recreation Experience

Redhead's trails were designed to offer a world-class mountain bike experience. A cadre of some of the best trail builders in the country were brought into the project simultaneously to build the system quickly but also to create unique trail experiences. Each trail builder's style is different, creating a varied and versatile experience for riders.

Data to consider for comparison: Cuyuna's second year (2012) trail counters totaled just over 22,000 riders. Redhead's year three (2022) trail counter totaled just over 70,000 riders and pedestrians. While not close enough in proximity to the Twin Cities to host metro/urban day riders, Redhead offers the region's economy opportunity to host extended stays in hotels, short term rentals, and campgrounds

Redhead is notably equipped to host large races and festivals, unlike neighboring Tioga or Cuyuna. The trailhead is located next to the St. Louis County Fairgrounds, an expansive open area designed to host thousands. The economic impact of large events and races extend to multiple communities in the region: Chisholm, Hibbing, Keewatin, Nashwauk, Buhl, Mountain Iron, Virginia, and more.

Provides a Natural and Scenic Setting Offering a Compelling Sense of Place

Sense of place at Redhead is both inexplicable and breathtaking. The tremendous landscape of Redhead was built by miners with machines and this man-made element is why it almost feels out of place. Looking over the Pillsbury Pit, bikers and hikers cannot help but think they are somewhere in the southwest, albeit with more water. There are many untapped uses for

the lake in Redhead, a feature Redhead's leadership is excited to develop. The tree cover is still in its infant state and will only gain in size and greatness. Scott Linnenburger of Kay-Linn Enterprises in Boulder, CO (master planning, field design, and construction management of the Tioga, Redhead, and Giants Ridge parks) said this of Redhead's natural and scenic setting, "I didn't really know what we were getting into... I knew that the Redhead site was focused on a number of old iron pits that were flooded. So what I knew is that we had a lake, but when I stepped onto the site and saw all the vertical red walls, and white trunks of the birches, my jaw literally just dropped, and I thought, this is not what I expect. It's so, so much more."

Every foot of Redhead's trails is designed and constructed to maximize the engagement and experience of the rider. Redhead is known to be a fully immersive and according to Benji Neff (Director of Mountain Sports at Giants Ridge), "It's unlike anything you've ridden." If comparing Redhead to other mountain bike trail systems in the United States, liken it to the bluffs in Arkansas or the canyons in Southwest Utah.

Well-located to Serve a Regional Need and/or Tourist Destination

Outdoor adventure is nothing new to the region but has mostly been experienced in the Chisholm area on wheels WITH motors. Self-propelled adventure seekers are a new demographic of tourist we offer a warm welcome to. Chisholm's central location on the Iron Range fills a gap for outdoor recreation tourism between Cuyuna, Tioga and Giants Ridge. The four trail systems form a leapfrog riding adventure as described at Ridetherange.com. Chisholm is positioned and ready to offer a world class tourist experience beyond what is already provided within the museums. Chisholm has the right people and positions in place to grow the city as quintessential tourist destination. The movie industry with Lost Forty Studio made Chisholm home and more businesses are popping up and showing interest in an already vibrant downtown.

Another note on well-located: Redhead is the only mountain bike park directly sharing a portion of the paved Mesabi Trail which spans from Tioga to Giants Ridge, offering a trail system with complete interconnectedness. Being directly on the Mesabi Trail means bikers can enter and exit the park on two wheels, not only from Chisholm, but from neighboring Hibbing and Virginia and beyond.

While Redhead fills a need for outdoor adventure locally, tourism may be the most compelling driver behind Redhead. A scan of license plates in the Redhead lot on any given summer day spotlights plates from everywhere across the United States. Riding the Range is an ever-growing reality and it is bringing positive attention to northern Minnesota.

Fills a Gap in Recreational Opportunity within the Region

Small mountain bike trail systems and foot paths will continually be designed and dug throughout the region. There's always a local need for small trail systems, offering refuge and recreation to communities, but Redhead MTB Park is bigger than a backyard trail. Redhead is a grand showcase of the region's diverse landscape - mountainous man-made vistas above sheer red rocks, shining green blue lake, vibrant growing trees and underbrush. The dynamic professional trail building in the first 25 miles of Redhead establish it as world-class trail system.

The team behind Redhead changed legislation to get behind the mine fences, and they aren't stopping. Goals Redhead's leadership are working toward include inspiring people of all ages, abilities and backgrounds to get on the trail, boosting outdoor recreation opportunities and tourism across the region, promoting safe and responsible use of the trails, and advancing diversity and inclusion on the trails.

Recent small steps taken toward these goals include: growing a local hiking group, building an Adopt-a-Trail maintenance program, obtaining DNR grant funding for a free community and schools snowshoe program, partnering with local non-profit Voices for Ethnic and Multicultural Awareness (VEMA) to establish outdoor adventure programming, establishing a free bicycle rental program by local non-profit Kids' Plus, applying for LCCMR funding for adaptive trails expansion, and more.
