Regional Significance Statement

Warroad Point Park in Warroad, MN is the only American port on Lake of the Woods. Lake of the Woods is the regional destination for unique lake-related outdoor recreational experiences. The park provides modern camping facilities, with amenities, in an urban setting with access to world-class walleye fishing. Along with arts, heritage and culture, Warroad and the park is a crown-jewel recreational destination for people from the Upper Midwest, Minnesota, the U.S., Canada, and Worldwide.

Overview/Description of Park or Trail

Warroad Point Park is a 161-acre park located in the city of Warroad, MN. A key to the uniqueness is that Warroad is the only American port on Lake of the Woods, the sixth largest freshwater lake in the United

States. Historically, a commercial port/harbor was maintained by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers. The Park is also located adjacent to a seaplane base that is used for Customs and Border Patrol inspections. It is also considered an important recreational harbor. Warroad's Point Park on Lake of the Woods offers a robust waterfront that features three public boat ramps, a campground with 215 campsites, a groomed beach, an observation tower, picnic shelters, a fishing pier, a heated year-round fishing cleaning house, and generous parking - making Warroad Point Park a superb destination for outdoor enthusiasts.

A jetty walkway, two playgrounds, bike and walking paths, and a unique sand-bottom, filtered outdoor swimming pool also connect residents and tourists to the experience of healthy activities and natural places offered at Warroad Point Park.

Within the 307,000 Minnesota acres of Lake of the Woods waters, northern pike, perch, muskie, sturgeon, bass and trophy walleye, for which Lake of the Woods is well-known, are abundant. World-class fishing is great all four seasons of the year.

The confluence of Lake of the Woods and the Warroad River at the Park are prime water amenities for canoeing, water skiing, swimming, kayaking, tubing, fishing and observing wildlife and bird watching.

The northernmost part of the Pine to Prairie Birding Trail begins in Warroad. Wildlife and nature enthusiasts utilize Warroad's observation tower and drive-up nature viewing site to watch wildlife and birds and to get a superb view of the beautiful waters of Lake of the Woods.

We are honored that Minnesota State Highway 11 that runs through Warroad was named in 1990 by the Minnesota State Governor the Minnesota Wildflower Route. More than two million orchids blanket the Lake of the Woods area growing within walking, biking and driving distance of Warroad Point Park. Warroad's heritage is reflected in Highway 11 known as Waters of the Dancing Sky Scenic Byway, named for the Northern Lights that can best be seen dancing in the sky from Warroad Point Park. The area is unique in these outdoor experiences it provides. Along with water recreation enthusiasts, it is a destination for photographers, artists, architectural aficionados, youth groups and vacationing families as it has something for everyone.

Seven miles of walking and biking paths connect Warroad Point Park to several other uniquely-appointed city parks: Pocket Park, and Veterans Memorial Park and Allison Park.

Warroad Point Park and its campgrounds are a jumping-off point for the great outdoors. ATV/OHV riders, snowmobilers, cross-country skiers, horseback riders, fat-tire bikers, hunters, hikers, wildlife enthusiasts, bird watchers and berry pickers have access to Hayes Lake State Park, Beltrami Island State Forest, Zippel Bay State Park, Lost River State Forest, and Northwest Angle State Forest - all within an easy drive from Warroad.

- The proposed flood wall at the bridge will protect the park and Warroad from high water levels on Lake of the Woods. Prior high water events have required that the city and USACE build an earthen plug at the bridge, which has been problematic in terms of response time and maintenance.
- The city is developing conceptual plans for the harbor and channel and is undergoing early coordination with the USACE and Minnesota DNR for permitting the harbor and channel project. A joint permit application will be submitted Winter 2020.

Boardwalk and Bike/Walk Path

- A boardwalk originating at the park will weave around the marina, the park and along the Warroad River. It will connect outdoor enthusiasts to healthy outdoor activities and access to several recreational sites and paths throughout the city. Warroad Point Park and the boardwalk along the Warroad River leading to downtown patio dining will extend the "life along the water" experience.
- An extension to the Park's west bike/walk path will connect Warroad's paths to the Rail Trail, to Bemis Hill, and to the Star of the North Trail. The Rail Trail is twenty-two miles of abandoned RR track, groomed and maintained by the Roseau/LOW Sportsmen Club. The rail bed is used by ATVs, fat-bike riders, snowmobilers, and walkers. The Sportsman Club, with several partners, is planning to either apply asphalt or a granite base to the trail - making it easier to use and to groom.

The Star of the North Trail is a seventy-mile bike trail through beautiful and in areas, challenging, terrain of the Beltrami Island State Forest. It is demanding enough to be a destination for the world-class mountain bike and fat-bike riders and the international cross-country biker coming out of Canada.

- Working with city leaders across our region, plans are underway to connect our neighboring communities with a walking and biking trail system. Warroad Point Park, Warroad and Lake of the Woods is a natural hub offering experiences unlike any other in our region with the views of lakes, rivers, forests and the gateway to Canada

General Site Characteristics

The Warroad Point Park is situated about one mile from the Warroad downtown district and is located on the Southwest shores of Lake of the Woods. The park, campgrounds and proposed marina are located adjacent to former historical Native American Villages that also served as trapping and trading posts. The park lies on the banks of the Warroad River confluence, making it a destination location for a myriad of activities both now and in the past. The park carries a rich and important history that reflects the proud heritage of the community. The site is known for all-season access, spectacular sunrises, dancing northern lights, and gentle breezes in a natural setting.

As far as park amenities, RV Campers along with the back-to-basics tent campers love camping at the park. The existing campgrounds include 215 campsites of which 137 have full hookups, 28 have water and electricity, 33 have electricity only and 17 are primitive. Recreation opportunities offered at the park include camping, picnicking, fishing, boating, hiking and swimming while nearby (within the city) are tennis courts, basketball courts, softball fields and an ice arena. About one mile to the north of the City is the Warroad Estates Golf Course an 18 hole championship course for those who wish to golf.

Warroad Safe Harbor and Marina Summer storms can form and be life threatening in a short period of time, often times catching boaters and fishermen off guard and stranding them while creating real safety concerns. The existing harbor is inaccessible from Lake of the Woods, and the proposed newly accessible harbor and marina will not only provide public safety, but will also add greatly to the public access and boating amenities so valuable to the appeal of this regional destination. - There is minimal dock space currently available at Warroad Point Park; the proposed harbor and marina will provide 100 or more docks. - A bait house and fuel facility, which are currently not offered at the Point, will be welcome offerings for boaters. - Inclement weather on super-sized Lake of the Woods can very quickly catch boaters by surprise. City of Warroad and its partners are also working with Minnesota Department of Natural Resources for the development of Government Island in the Warroad River upstream near the CN railroad bridge @ Highway #11. This will be destination for visitors at Warroad Point Park to enjoy events, festivities and outdoor activities year around. Situated directly across from the LOW Brewery and Pocket Park, it is also a gateway into our downtown district for eating, shopping and other services. Another unique offering in Warroad from the rest of our region is The Warroad Wellness Center. Located in our downtown district, it will include physical therapy and rehabilitation services, mental and behavior health and a 24 hour/7 day a week national brand fitness center. With the designation as a Regional Park, the vision of the Warroad Point Park leverages other related offerings as well as strategic developments in Warroad, both long

and short term (e.g., Safe Harbor, rental bikes, historical markers, new parks, Warroad River gazebos, conference center on Lake of the Woods, Warroad Folk School programming and Doc's kayak rentals.).

Special Recreational Feature Park Classification

Provides a High-Quality Outdoor Recreation Experience

A premium is placed on quality of diverse experiences to encourage visitors to return time and again.

Lake of the Woods is over 70 miles long and wide and contains more than 14,552 islands and 65,000 miles of shoreline. The NW Angle on the north side of the lake offers short day-trips from Point Park by car in summer

and groomed and marked snowmobile trails in the winter. Miles of sandy beaches await. Massacre Island, Eagles Rock, and Fort St Charles are all great history lessons. Birding and wildlife are abundant in the area, as are the wild flowers, wild rice, blueberries, and raspberries. Painted Rock Island at Morison, ON has evidence of the areas earliest inhabitants! Paintings dating over 1,000 years can be seen here. Late at night the Northern Lights dance across the sky.

The Beltrami forest offers 500 miles of groomed "wilderness trails". With the Lake included, nearly unlimited ice riding is available for sledding enjoyment.

Professional birdwatchers, photographers and naturalists seek our area. Between 250 to 300 species of birds make their homes here throughout the year. The Park and surrounding area is perfect habitat for the Bald Eagle and the Sandhill Crane. The Sandhill is among Minnesota's largest bird species. The area is also a nesting ground for Trumpeters. They mate for life and return to the same nesting spot every year. Other species are the Piping Plover, American White Pelicans, elusive Connecticut Warbler, Great Grey Owl, Pileated, Black-Backed, and Three-Toed Woodpeckers; Evening, Pine and Rose-Breasted Grosbeaks; Spruce Hens; Roughed Grouse & Loons.

The Warroad River connects Warroad Point Park to the unique and relaxing experiences offered in downtown Warroad with the LOW Brewery, coffee houses, restaurants, retail, Warroad Folk School, state of the art conference center, the Warroad Heritage Center - designed in Franklin Lloyd Wright style - creating a magnificent sense of space for the library and museum.

Lake of the Woods is a one-of-a-kind place. People are drawn to the water and landscape; the infinite adventures, and sense of wild; the afternoon light sparkling on the water, the sunrises and sunsets. Northern Lights dancing on the still, smooth water of the Lake. The quiet. This place holds a magic! This area really is a hidden gem, much of it undiscovered, an artists paradise, an adventurers dream; a fisherman's heaven.

Well-located to Serve a Regional Need and/or Tourist Destination

Connectivity to the park via local, regional, or state-level trails is a key amenity for the Warroad Point Park. Warroad Point Park is a 161-acre park located in the city of Warroad, MN on the only American port on Lake of the Woods, the sixth largest freshwater lake in the United States. Float planes fly visitors to and from the Northwest Angle and ski planes land on the Warroad River for Lions Club breakfasts. The Park is also considered an important recreational harbor for boaters. The Park on Lake of the Woods offers a robust waterfront that features three public boat ramps, a campground with 215 campsites, a groomed beach, an observation tower, picnic shelters, a fishing pier, a heated year-round fishing cleaning house, and generous parking - making Warroad Point Park a superb destination for outdoor enthusiasts. The nearest park, with similar amenities, is 140 miles south of Warroad.

Warroad was honored to host the Great Lake Writers Conference a couple years ago. Writers from all over country were in Warroad covering our unique and wonderful outdoor recreation. They did product reviews at Warroad Lost River Sportsmen Complex and hunted in Beltrami Island State Forest. This gained Warroad national recognition in the world of outdoor living. The Warroad Roughed Grouse Society has gained national recognition for Warroad with writers and videographers filming life outdoors in the Beltrami Island State Forest and on Lake of the Woods. We currently host hunters and naturalists as they choose Warroad as their destination.

Warroad has seen a 33% growth in tourism over the last 10 years. (Lodging Tax data 2019) The United States Port of Entry at Warroad logs 142,000 vehicles a year crossing the Canadian border into the United States (over a 10 year average).

Fills a Gap in Recreational Opportunity within the Region

The Warroad Point Park is a high quality outdoor recreational opportunity that is not available in the region. It fills a discernible and critical gap in an area with a recreation opportunity shortage. The park complements (not duplicates) recreational opportunities otherwise available in the region.

Warroad is unique in its location as a Regional Park, attracting neighbors from the northern corridor of MN as well as visitors from all over the world. With Park as their base camp, within 30 miles theyll have access to hunting experiences just dreamed of. The attraction to our region includes the vast amount of public access land that is available to anyone, anytime. Visitors will find a variety of game, the most common being deer, bear, grouse, ducks, and geese. Our deer are the large-bodied deer that are typically associated with Canadian provinces.

With the Regional Park designation, there is significant growth opportunity for our businesses as well as growth in numbers of travelers and tourists. US Tourism dollars spent on the south shore of Lake of the Woods was \$184M (US); spending on the entire lake reaching into the NW Angle, Canada and the islands on the lake was \$734M (US).
