The Great River Park Complex is comprised of Bend in the River Regional Park located in Benton County, and Mississippi River County Park located in Stearns County. The parks are separated by the Mississippi River. The Great River Park Complex is roughly 15 minutes from downtown St. Cloud, MN, and within a 2-hour drive from the Twin Cities metro area.

Bend in the River Regional Park:

11231 River Road NE, Rice Minnesota 56367. Located approximately 1 mile south of the City of Rice in Benton County. Bend in the River Regional Park encompasses almost .66 mile of Mississippi River shoreline.

Mississippi River County Park:

41300 County Road 1, Rice Minnesota 56367. Located approximately 1 mile south of the City of Rice in Stearns County. Mississippi River County Park incorporates an estimated 1.3 miles of Mississippi River shoreline.

Regional Significance Statement

Centrally located within the state of Minnesota just north of St. Cloud, the Great River Park Complex offers a variety of outdoor activities such as; summer and winter trails, access to the Mississippi River, archery ranges, historical sites, and restored native landscapes that enhance the quality of life of the local and regional population. This Complex protects approximately 600-acres and over 4 miles of shoreline from sprawling development along the world-renowned Mississippi River.

Natural Resource Based Regional Park

Overview/Description of Park or Trail

The Great River Park Complex is comprised of the Mississippi River County Park and Bend in the River Regional Park but is split by the Mississippi River. The 261- acre Michaelson Farm Wildlife Management Area (WMA) neighbors Bend in the River Regional Park and extends shoreline protection. There are no State Parks in Stearns or Benton County, thus the Great River Park Complex offers many amenities that serve a similar purpose to both local and regional residents.

Bend in the River Regional Park is a 289-acre park that was acquired in 2002 in anticipation to develop the historic farmstead into a significant county attraction for the public. Improvements to the property include; restoration of some farm fields to native tall grass prairie/oak savanna, construction of walking trails and river overlooks, and preservation/stabilization of historic farmstead buildings. Restoring the native landscape to pre-European settlement condition is a priority as well as the educating and understanding of the restoration process. Story-boards throughout the park inform visitors about the history of the area and the purpose of the work. With over 2.5 miles of aggregate hiking trail, visitors can spend their time walking along the Mississippi River and viewing the waterway from three different overlooks. Visitors can learn about the historic farmstead and farming practices of Central Minnesota in the northern section of the park. The southern portion offers additional parking, trails, and picnic tables.

Mississippi River County Park consists of 230-acres on the Mississippi River. The park is developed with 1.1 miles of roadway, over 5 miles of walking trails, over 4 miles of cross-country ski trails, an open-air shelter, open play area, two restroom locations, boat launch, 18-hole disc golf course, and an outdoor archery range. Mississippi River County Park offers group camping opportunities to non-profit youth organizations, bicyclist, and a canoe camping site. Native tall grass prairie/oak savanna restoration have occurred throughout the park. Future development by T.H.E Great River Archery Club proposes an indoor archery range on the park property. An additional proposed 74-acre purchase would allow for more facility development and shoreline restoration and protection. The variety of outdoor activities allows for visitors with any experience level to enjoy the outdoors. In 2018, the Mississippi River County Park saw an estimated 63,000; and hosted over ten non-profit events, graduation parties, scout camping, family gatherings, 3D archery competitions, and church events. Public/private partnerships, such as the one with T.H.E. Great River Archery Club and Hike Hoppers (a non profit focused on using the outdoors to enhance peoples wellbeing) will provide programming opportunities throughout this complex.

This Complex offers a multitude of activities that attract local and regional clientele and protects this section of the river from development; in an area that has no such protections in place. Overall the Complex and Michaelson Farm WMA will protect close to 600-acres of parkland and over 4 miles of shoreline.

General Site Characteristics

The world renowned Mississippi River starts in Itasca and flows south to the Gulf of Mexico. The Great River Park Complex is split by this great river. National bike trails, road excursions, and parks along the river provide extended biking, hiking, canoeing, or auto touring experience. The four seasons, and the variable climate of Minnesota gives visitors a different outdoor experience with each visit.

The Great River Park Complex and the adjacent Michaelson Farm WMA lie within the Mississippi River basin. This basin was formed by glaciers moving and melting millions of years ago. The Upper Mississippi River Valley was shaped primarily during the most recent glacial stage of the Great Ice Age. As the glaciers retreated, glacial lakes were breached, which reshaped the landscape where the Mississippi River presides. Thousands of years later, dams were built to create a consistent flow desired by loggers, fur traders, and millers. Before the dams were built along the shores were the Ojibwas hay fields, maple trees, gardens, cranberry marshes, wild rice marshes, villages and burial grounds. The area of the Great River Park Complex has significant history with the relationship between the Ojibwa people, Western European settlers, and commercial interests.

The Great River Park Complex boasts several native plant communities and rare species (federally and state listed) as identified in the Minnesota Biological Survey. These native plant areas include: flood plain forest, dry prairie barrens and willow-dogwood shrub swamp. The Great River Park Complex also lies within the transition zone of the tall grass prairies of the west and the deciduous forests of the east. This transition zone forms a unique landscape known as oak savanna. The oak savanna ecosystem once covered approximately 10% of Minnesota but today less than 1% of this ecosystem remains. In recent years the value of the oak savanna ecosystem was recognized and scattered efforts at preservation and restoration began. Benton and Stearns County encourage and actively participate in native plant community restoration. The Mississippi waterway is also use for avian migration and it is estimated that approximately 60% of North American birds use the Mississippi River basin as their flyway.

The various activities such as disc golf through the pine forest or restored prairie, walking, cross-country skiing, or archery lessons, and more; allows for a high diversity of visitors. The uniqueness of the variety of native plant and animal communities, lack of development on both sides of the river, the important historical components that helped shape the area, and the beauty of the Mississippi River provides a sought-after destination for local and regional users.

The Great River Park Complex is one of few public spaces in the region offering undeveloped Mississippi River frontage and high river bluff views. Given the Complex's emphasis on nature and low-intensity development, park users can enjoy an escape from urban environments to a place that is truly peaceful.

Bend in the River Regional Park offers over a-half mile of incredible views of the Mississippi River.

With over 200 acres of land, it provides visitors the opportunity to hike through riverside forest, restored prairie, and visit a historic homestead. It is also a great place to watch birds migrating. With the Michaelson Farm WMA to the Northwest, wildlife movement is

abundant and can include; deer, small game, upland birds, pheasant, waterfowl, and turkey.

Mississippi River County Park has over 5 miles of looping trails that intertwine between lowland river wetlands, mixed forest, and restored oak savanna. The park offers a variety of activities for all ages, abilities and experience levels including but not limited to: hiking, archery, disc golf, fishing, snow shoeing, and cross-country skiing. Picnic facilities allow for different size gatherings to site down and spend time together outside. Restroom amenities are scattered throughout the park. Future amenities may include another shelter down by the boat landing. The public/private partnership with the T.H.E Great River Archery group and the construction of indoor and outdoor archery facilities will welcome additional park visitors and fill a gap of needed space for this lifetime sport. The overall goal is to provide a regional indoor archery facility for educational, charitable, and amateur athletics. Currently, there are no other archery complexes in our region capable of hosting the type of activities that are being proposed. (See brochure for more info).

Preserves a Regionally-Significant and Diverse Natural or Historic Landscape

The Mississippi River begins in northern Minnesota and winds through the north-central part of the state, splitting The Great River Park Complex. The Complex, in conjunction to the adjacent Michaelson Farm WMA, protects approximately two miles of riverbank, on either side of the river, from development and allows the public to enjoy the historic and scenic waterway.

Bend in the River Regional Park reveals its history through the collection of farm buildings and illustrates the area of agricultural achievements in central Minnesota. The variety of outbuildings exemplified the diversified farming techniques that were encouraged in Minnesota following the over-production of wheat during the latter half of the ninetieth century. By the 1940s a potato warehouse was built to show the familys transition to a new type of crop. The Graves Farm has been determined eligible for listing on the National Registration of Historic Places.

The original 203 acres of the park were purchased from the Hiscock family and the property was established as Mississippi River County Park in 1973. The property boasts a variety of native and restored

The Great River Park complex is also located along the western boundary of the Anoka Sand Plain. The Anoka Sand Plain is a unique and susceptible ecological region consisting of droughty, sandy, upland soils that provide critical drinking water, recreational opportunities and essential habitat for rare plants and animals. Overall the Great River Park Complex preserves regionally significant and diverse natural and historic landscapes.

Well-located and Connected to Serve a Regional Population and/or Tourist Destination

The Great River Park Complex is centrally located within the state. A radius of 200 miles encompasses major cities like; Grand Forks and Fargo, ND; Moorhead, Brainerd, Duluth, St. Cloud, Minneapolis/St. Paul, and Rochester, MN; Eau Claire, and La Crosse, WI; reaching over 4 million people in three states. It is estimated that over 69,000 people visit the Great River Park Complex on an annual basis. This is also before the addition of a proposed indoor archery facility.

The Great River Park Complex is comprised of two different County Parks that are 8 minutes apart, function together as a local and regionally significant park for central Minnesota and the St. Cloud area and is complimented by the adjacent Wildlife Management Area. The Complex is located approximately 1 mile off Highway 10, south of the City of Rice and 12 miles north of St. Cloud. The access to State Highway 10 makes getting to the Complex easy for those who may wish to participate in a 3D or indoor archery shoot competition, need a rest from travel, those who may wish to take advantage of the world-renowned smallmouth bass fishery, or persons looking for a quiet walk or ski along the river. The Great River Park Complex is also located along several State and National Scenic Byways, such as the Mississippi River Trail (bicycle route), the Great River Road (vehicle route), and the Mississippi River State Water Trail (watercraft route).

Fills a Gap in Recreational Opportunity within the Region

Today the Complex fills a gap in recreational opportunity within the region by providing: public access to the Mississippi River (boat or canoe); fishing opportunities (including shore fishing); access to a variety of unique natural areas; camping for those canoeing, non-profit youth groups or people riding their bikes; a view of the river with minimal to almost no development; an outdoor archery range; a 18 - hole disc golf course; hiking; cross-country skiing; historical interpretation, environmental and historical interpretation/programming; off-road biking; and many other recreational activities.
